

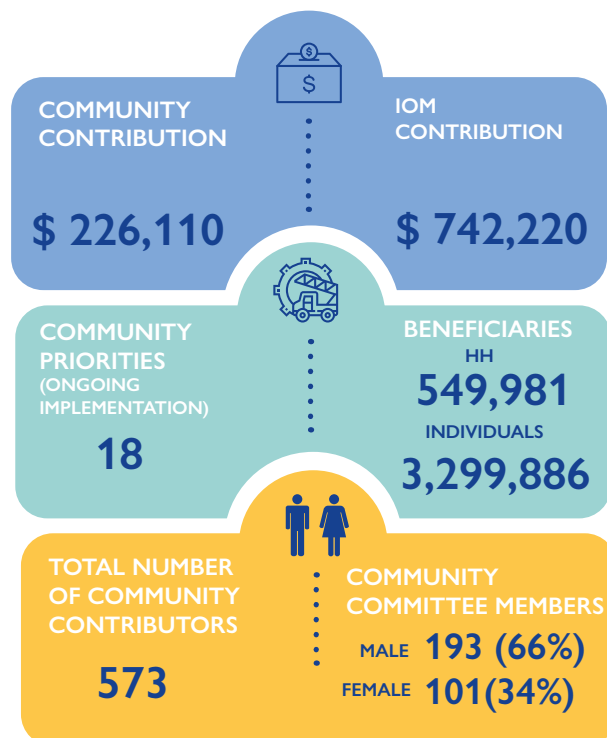


MATCHING GRANT IOM SOMALIA OVERVIEW



The Matching Grant Mechanism enables communities to identify, fundraise for, co-finance, and jointly implement a community priority of their choice, based on a set criteria.

The Matching Grant enables and incentivizes populations to work across the deep divides in politics, identity, and community groups, by co-financing collective goals that foster genuine interdependence. Communities are driving local change forward by adopting IOM's new tools, which facilitate joint investment in public goods, services, and infrastructure to promote inclusive ownership and operational sustainability together with the local government. By supporting communities and local governments to be the main drivers of their own recovery, the activity enhances agency, transparency, and trust.



WHY OPT FOR MATCHING GRANT?



HOW IT WORKS

Target communities come together to collectively identify a priority that benefits the whole population of an area and for which they agree to fundraise. This could be a school, for example, equally accessible to young people from all surrounding communities.

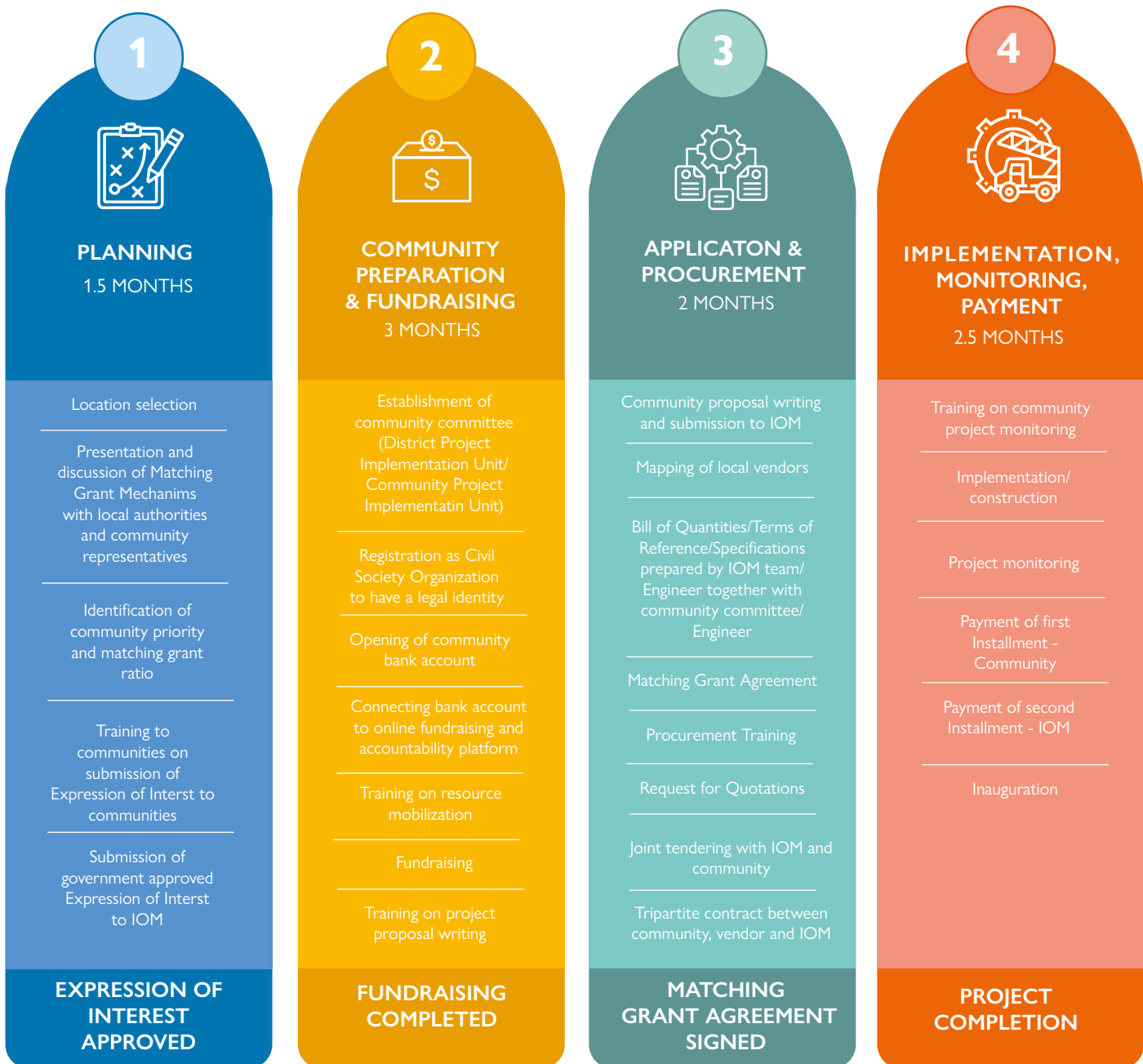
IOM teams then train the communities on the matching grant process including fundraising, procurement, and the implementation processes.

The team assists the communities to open a joint bank account, to hold a competitive bid for local vendors, and to set up an online fundraising and accountability platform to monitor financial contributions

The critical element is the matching mechanism, which encourages diverse groups, even those with historical grievances, to collaborate rather than compete for

resources. A set criteria determines the matching grant ratio which can double, triple, quadruple or quintuple community funds within a pre-established funding ceiling. The more diverse the contributing communities, the larger the scope of the project, and the more the project contributes to peace and stability, the higher the matching grant ratio.

Through IOM's Matching Grant Mechanism, communities acquire the necessary skills and systems to identify, finance, and manage their own projects in the future. In addition, the introduction of a novel tripartite contract between IOM, communities, and vendors, generates a self-regulating accountability framework that ensures transparent and reliable delivery.

COMMUNITY PRIORITIES

Priorities identified by the communities across Galmudug and Hirshabelle States in Somalia primarily fall under infrastructure and a few procured goods that increase access to both critical and essential services. Schools followed by boreholes and multipurpose centres are the primary services prioritized by communities.
